YUVEZZI™ (carbachol and brimonidine tartrate ophthalmic solution) 2.75% / 0.1%, for topical ophthalmic use

Summary of Information about YUVEZZI

What is YUVEZZI?

YUVEZZI is a prescription eye drop for adults with blurry close-up vision due to age.

How should I use YUVEZZI?

Use one drop of YUVEZZI in each eye, once a day. Each vial contains enough medicine for both eyes. Do not let the tip of the vial touch your eye, eyelid, or any other surface. Throw away the open vial and any unused medicine in it.

If you need to use another type of eye drop, wait at least 5 minutes before or after using YUVEZZI to use the other drop.

If you wear contact lenses, remove them before using YUVEZZI. Wait at least 10 minutes after using YUVEZZI before you put them back in your eyes.

Do not use YUVEZZI if you currently have inflammation of the iris (iritis) or if you are allergic to any of its ingredients. See the end of this Brief Summary for a complete list of ingredients.

YUVEZZI should be used with caution in people with depression, orthostatic hypotension (a type of low blood pressure that is triggered by standing up), and certain conditions that affect circulation, including: cerebral or coronary insufficiency (conditions that result in reduced blood supply to the brain or heart), Raynaud's phenomenon (a condition that causes reduced blood supply to the fingers and toes), and thromboangiitis obliterans (also known as Buerger's disease, a condition that results in reduced blood supply to the arms and legs).

What are the possible side effects of YUVEZZI?

The most common side effects are headache, impaired vision, and eye pain and/or eye irritation upon use. Most side effects were generally mild, didn't last long, and went away on their own.

YUVEZZI may cause temporary blurry, dim, or dark vision. If you experience this, avoid driving (especially at night), using machinery, and participating in hazardous activities.

Rare cases of tear and detachment of the retina (a layer of cells at the back of your eye that senses light) have occurred with eye drops like YUVEZZI in people who are prone to retinal detachment or have pre-existing retinal disease. Your eye doctor is advised to check your retina before prescribing YUVEZZI. Call your doctor right away if you suddenly have flashes of light, floaters,

or vision loss, as these may be signs of a retinal detachment.

These are not all the possible side effects.

Before using YUVEZZI, tell your eye doctor if you:

- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if YUVEZZI will harm your unborn baby.
- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known if YUVEZZI passes into your breast milk.

What other medicines may interact with YUVEZZI?

- Antihypertensives (drugs that lower blood pressure)
- Cardiac glycosides (drugs used to treat certain heart conditions, including heart failure and atrial fibrillation)
- CNS depressants (alcohol, opiates, barbiturates, sedatives, or anesthetics)
- Tricyclic antidepressants (drugs used to treat depression, nerve pain, insomnia, and anxiety)
- Monoamine oxidase (MAO) inhibitors (a type of antidepressant)

Tell your eye doctor about all the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, dietary and herbal supplements.

General Information about safe and effective use

Medicines are sometimes prescribed for purposes other than those listed in the Brief Summary. Do not use YUVEZZI for a condition for which it was not prescribed. Do not give YUVEZZI to other people, even if they have the same symptoms you have. It may harm them.

You can ask your eye doctor for information about YUVEZZI that is written for health care professionals.

What are the ingredients in YUVEZZI?

- Active ingredients: carbachol, brimonidine tartrate.
- Inactive ingredients: hydroxypropyl methylcellulose (HPMC), sodium phosphate monobasic monohydrate, sodium phosphate dibasic heptahydrate, water for injection, and may also include hydrochloric acid and/or sodium hydroxide
